Monitoring transboundary water cooperation: how the dedicated SDG indicator helps

Description: Transboundary water cooperation is key to achieve SDG6 on water and sanitation and the whole 2030 Agenda. Under the umbrella of UN-Water, UNECE and UNESCO, the custodian agencies for this indicator, have led the development of the methodology for its calculation. #SIWISofa: Supplying Rural Areas with Water and Electricity Simultaneously /

#SIWISofa : Approvisionner simultanément les zones rurales en eau et en électricité

Description: Providing sustainable access to water and energy proves difficult in rural areas due to the isolation of sites, the low incomes that limit ability to pay for services, the size of the projects, and their extremely low profitability. Veolia and Odial Solutions propose to use a single concession framework to offer a comprehensive service covering both urban and rural areas, thus capturing the economy of scale and allowing tariff transfers and synergies among locations and clients. This solution entails the extensive use of decentralized technical solutions such as solar pumps, stand-pipes among others / Approvisionner de l'eau et de l'énergie s'avère difficile dans des zones rurales en raison de l'isolation des sites, les faibles revenus qui limitent la possibilité de payer pour des services, la taille des projets et leur rentabilité très faible. Veolia et Odial Solutions proposent d'utiliser un cadre de concession unique afin d'offrir un service inclusif couvrant aussi bien les zones urbaines que rurales, entraînant des économies d'échelles et permettant des transferts de tarifs et synergies entre les localisations et les clients. Cette solution implique une utilisation massive de solutions techniques décentralisées telles que les pompes solaires, les colonnes d'alimentation, etc.

Governing the paracommons: The case of Palestinian water/ Gouverner les “paracommons” : le cas de l'eau en Palestine

Description: This panel addresses the governance of Palestinian water by studying its paracommons. This term designates the material gains potentially generated by the improvement of efficiency within various systems all drawing on the same source of water. Such gains are dynamic because the efficiency gain in one system often entails a loss in a neighbouring system or in a distant, yet interlinked, system. These material gains constitute a new commons, the appropriation of which needs to be governed./ Ce panel adresse la question de la gouvernance de l'eau en Palestine en étudiant ses “paracommons”. Ce concept designe les gains matériels potentiellement générés par l'amélioration de l'efficience de plusieurs systèmes tirant tous sur la même source d'eau. Safe water enterprises: The opportunity to reach a billion people? / Les “safe water entreprises” : une opportunité pour toucher un milliard de personnes?

Description: This session will draw on the findings from a new, in-depth study of SWEs and the first-hand experience of these enterprises to demonstrate the critical role they can play in achieving SDG 6. SWEs can provide safe water for at least a billion people of the estimated 4.4 billion people who do not consume safe water daily because of unimproved sources and/or inadequate treatment. Comprehensive analysis from this study provides a rich body of evidence and analysis from 14 SWEs across the globe and will frame the session, complemented by examples from several enterprises directly/ Cette session capitalisera sur les enseignements d'une nouvelle étude approfondie portant sur les “safe water enterprises”, des solutions décentralisées pour l'eau avec une forte approche entrepreneuriale, elle abordera ainsi le rôle que peuvent jouer ces entités dans l'atteinte de l'ODD 6. Lessons from the 2017 Integrated Baseline Process for SDG6 Monitoring

Description: The UN-Water family is working to align, integrate and expand existing monitoring and reporting efforts to ensure a harmonised monitoring and reporting of the entire water cycle. The “Integrated monitoring of water and sanitation related SDG targets” (GEMI), complements WHO/UNICEF “Joint Monitoring Programme for Water Supply and Sanitation” (JMP) and UN-Water “Global Analysis and Assessment of Sanitation and Drinking-Water” (GLAAS), and – building on national and regional efforts – will together be able to monitor and report on global progress towards the entirety of SDG6. One focus of the initiative in 2017 is the rollout of an *integrated* baseline process in approximately 30 countries, aiming to facilitate the monitoring in each country of a critical mass of SDG6 indicators across government departments and sectors, as well as to generate a global baseline for SDG6 that allows for integrated analysis across indicators. Participants will learn about the initial experiences of countries and supporting agencies from this process in 2017.

Fully engaging the disenfranchised society in water governance / Intégrer les plus démunis au sein de la gouvernance de l'eau

Description: The division between the middle to upper class parts of society and those more disenfranchised and less affluent is becoming increasingly pronounced in developed countries. Communities are becoming further segmented between the "haves" and "have nots". This separation gives rise to an imbalance of provision of basic services, puts stress on public assistance programs, and can even lead to civil unrest and political controversy. However, equitable sharing of resources and wealth resulting from growth is a responsibility of governments, utilities, businesses, and civil society at large. Historically, water has not been on the forefront of such issues, however more often, it is at the heart of the crisis. La division entre classe moyenne et classe supérieure de la société d'une part et les plus démunis d'autre part devient de plus en plus prononcée au sein des pays développés. Les communautés se segmentent entre « ceux qui ont » et « ceux qui n'ont pas ». NDC Explorer: Water in 163 Climate Plans and Selected Cases

Description: This session explores the role of water in countries' climate action plans under the Paris Climate Agreement, the so called (intended) Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), and their potential contributions to simultaneously achieving SDG 6 on water and SDG 13 on climate of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
